<u>Item no. (2) Dennis DiBiase, Co-Chair – Woodland Hills Impacts and Policies Committee Community Impact Statement (16-068)</u>

Discussion and possible vote:

The Woodland Hills Impacts and Policies Committee recommends that the Woodland Hills-Warner Center Neighborhood Council supports the safety countermeasures of education and enforcement to combat speed, a common contributing factor for collisions resulting in severe and fatal injury. Due to the lack of current speed surveys on our city streets, the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) is unable to effectively enforce speeding infractions with proven and safe use of laser radar. LAPD has written 78,000 less citations to enforce the safety of our streets. The Woodland Hills- Warner Center Neighborhood Council requests the Los Angeles City Council create a council file to immediately fund speed surveys on streets identified by LAPD, LADOT and the communities that need immediate attention to public safety.

DIR-2016-2648-SPP Enterprise Rent-A-Car

22846 Ventura Boulevard, Woodland Hills, CA 91367

Discussion and possible action:

Having held three public hearings for the application concerning DIR-2016-2648-SPP for the demolition of an existing used car sales lot and Construction of a new (1) story Rental Office with Accessory Storage Building.

WHEREAS, there has been three meetings with the owner and the PLUM Committee regarding this project; and

WHEREAS, based on the application materials presented by the applicant dated August 18, 2016, as revised on drawings prepared by Jeff Cooper Architects submitted September 1, 2016, the requirements of the Ventura Bl./Cahuenga Bl. Corridor Specific Plan have been substantially met; and

WHEREAS, additional suggested improvements, changes and conditions were presented in the third iteration of plans have been discussed, accepted and incorporated by the developer;

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Planning, Land Use and Mobility Committee, for the findings and conditions stated herein above, finds that the proposed application for the Enterprise Rent-A -Car facility at 22846 (22842 – 22860) Ventura Blvd receive the support of the Board of the Woodland Hills-Warner Center Neighborhood Council with the following conditions:

The applicant commits to building the glass fence as presented on September 1, 2016 to enhance the customer experience.

The applicant commits to maintaining landscaping and glass over time.

The applicant will comply with the cities signage requirements.

Applicant will add at least one pathway through parkway from curb face to sidewalk.

Applicant will not use banners beyond 30 days.

Applicant agrees to the following timeline – once demolition is completed, site preparation and grading will begin within 10 days of issuance of Phase 1 permit. Completion of Phase 1 is to take no more than 4 months, Phase 2 construction to being within 30 days of issuance of permits. Phase 2 construction to be completed within 9 months.

Interim fencing will be opaque construction fencing (e.g. chain link with green screening). Applicant agrees to add pathway through front parkway area

Additionally, the PLUM Committee recommends that the Board of the Woodland Hills-Warner Center Neighborhood Council advise the City of Los Angeles Planning Department and Council District 3 Councilmember Bob Blumenfield of its findings, and subsequent recommendation to APPROVE this application.

AT&T Wireless – City Reference Number: 2016005634 modification of current cell phone tower LA0276 located at: 23150 ½ Burbank Blvd., Woodland Hills 91367

As pertaining to City Reference Number 2016005634, having held two public hearings for the application by AT&T for modification of wireless facility LA0276 at 23150 ½, Burbank Blvd. in Woodland Hills, the Planning, Land Use and Mobility Committee hereby finds that:

WHEREAS, based on the materials provided by the applicant's representative, dated 8/15/16, all of the site modifications will take place in the public right-of- way with no involvement of private property; and

WHEREAS, the antennas replacing the existing antennas will be the same size, at the same height, in the same location and radiate in the same direction as the existing antennas; and

WHEREAS, the site modifications will reduce the visual impact of the site to local residences, pedestrians, and vehicular traffic; and

WHEREAS, the applicant has agreed to exercise care so as not to damage the sprinkler system adjacent to the public sidewalk during site modification activities; and

WHEREAS, the addition of vault vents flush with the soil surface in the landscaped area outside the block wall will not interfere with the maintenance of the vegetation;

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Planning, Land Use and Mobility Committee, for the findings and conditions stated herein above, finds that the proposed application for the AT&T wireless site LA0276 modification at 23150 ½ Burbank Blvd. receive the support of the Board of the Woodland Hills-Warner Center Neighborhood Council for the requested actions with the following condition(s):

Condition 1: The applicant shall exercise care to ensure that the sprinkler system for the landscaped area outside the block wall on Burbank Blvd. is not damaged during site modification.

Condition 2: The applicant shall water and maintain the drought tolerant shrubs by the electric meter pedestal for a minimum of 6 months until they are well established.

Mulholland Drive Community Clean Up

Discussion and possible action:

Motion to Approve the Beautification Committee Spending \$250 for Refreshments at the September 17 Mulholland Drive Community Clean Up

Whereas, the Beautification committee met Tuesday, August 23rd at the West Valley Warner Center Chamber of commerce offices to discuss planning of the committees first cleanup. The cleanup will take place on September 17th, 2016 beginning at 8:30 AM and lasting until 12 PM. The objective is to straighten up the center median on Mulholland Highway. We will rake all of the organic waste including pine needles leaves and loose dirt into neat furrows and removing all paper trash. We anticipate having 30 adults participating. The Beautification committee voted to provide refreshments not to exceed \$250 in expense.

Therefore, WHWCNC Beautification Committee recommends that WHWCNC approve \$250 for water and refreshments for the volunteers who are expected to participate in the September 17thcleanup of Mulholland Highway. Annual Valley Disaster Preparedness Fair

Whereas, the Public Safety Committee requests that the Board approve funds of up to \$600.00 from the 2016/2017 NC Budget to fund a NC outreach booth at the 9th Annual Valley Disaster Preparedness Fair, sponsored by the Southern California Preparedness Foundation – a 501C3 entity, to be held on Saturday, October 1, 2016 at North Hills LAFD Station 87 (near the intersection of Balboa & Devonshire).

The event is intended to educate stakeholders on how to be better prepared for emergencies and is supported by other area NCs, Councilmember Mitchell Englander, County Supervisor Michael Antonovich, the Los Angeles City Fire Department – and includes presentations from MySafe: LA for seniors, the Department of Neighborhood Empowerment and various disaster response agencies.

Therefore, the WHWCNC Public Safety Committee requests the WHWCNC approve up to a \$500 payment to the Southern California Preparedness Foundation for an outreach both and program inclusion at the 9th Annual Valley Disaster Preparedness Fair, and up to \$100 for outreach and collateral materials to be used at the NC's booth and distributed at the fair.
